- 14 Pot Plant, flowering – pot not to exceed 19cm/7.5in at the top
- 15 Pot Plant, foliage – pot not to exceed 19cm/7.5in at the top
- 16 Cut Cottage Flowers - for maximum variety and effect, in a vase.
Millennium Cup for best in Class 16
- 17* Annuals - cut collection of three kinds, one cultivar in each vase
- 18 Floribunda Roses - two vases of three cut sprays, one or more cultivars
Keyword Challenge Cup for best in Class 18
- 19* Hybrid Tea Roses - six cut, one or more cultivars
Thornley Cup for best in class 19
- 20 Pansies - six cut stems placed in a container provided
- 21 Perennial Cut Flowers - two vases, one kind in each vase
- 22 Sweet Peas - vase containing seven cut stems
- 23 French Marigolds – six cut stems placed in a container provided
- 24 Gladioli - vase containing one cut stem
- 25 Calendula - vase containing seven cut stems
- 26 Antirrhinum - vase containing seven cut stems
- 27 Clematis - vase containing five cut blooms of any variety
- 28 Cactus and/or other Succulent – two pots

Rossiter Cup – highest amount of prize money Classes 14-28
- 29* Vegetables - Collection of five kinds with only one cultivar of a kind.
Numbers of each kind to be as stated in Classes 30-48
J Stone Cup for best in Class 29
- 30 Cabbages - two with 7.5cm/3in of stalk
- 31 Cauliflowers - two with 7.5cm/3in of stalk
- 32 Lettuces - two with roots (Cabbage variety)
- 33 Lettuces - two with roots (Cos variety)
- 34 Marrows - two
- 35 Peas - dish of seven pods
- 36 French Beans Dwarf or Climbing - dish of seven pods
- 37 Runner Beans - dish of seven pods
- 38 Broad Beans - dish of seven pods
- 39 Carrots - three long pointed with tops cut to 7.5cm/3in
- 40 Carrots - three other than long pointed with tops cut to 7.5cm/3in
- 41 Beet - three with tops cut to 7.5cm/3in
- 42 Shallots - nine
- 43 Shallots (pickling) - nine maximum size 3cm/1¼in diameter
- 44 Onions - three each of which is 250g or under with tops cut to not more than 7.5cm/3in
- 45 Onions - three each of which is over 250g with tops cut to not more than 7.5cm/3in
- 46 Radishes - bunch of ten
- 47 Potatoes - dish of five White
- 48 Potatoes - dish of five Coloured

- 53 Blackcurrants - dish of ten strigs as grown
- 54 Raspberries - dish of ten with stalks

- 55 Loganberries - dish of ten with stalks
- 56 Gooseberries - dish of ten
- 57 Rhubarb - three sticks - leaf blades should be trimmed back to approx 7.5cm/3in.
- 58 Rhubarb - longest stick of Rhubarb (Novelty Class)
- Keswick Challenge Cup- Highest number of first prizes in Classes 14-58**
- Arthur Harris Cup – Highest amount of prize money from classes 29-58**
- 68* Patio Pot/container – planted by entrant, no dimension of pot to exceed 38cm/15in
- George VI Coronation Cup for best in Class 68**
- 69 Fuchsia - Six cut blooms, one or more cultivars, placed in container provided
- 70* Hardy Cut Flowers - Collection of Herbaceous Perennials and Bulbous Plants (Annuals excluded). Three kinds, one cultivar and colour in each vase
- Wilkinson Challenge Cup for best in Class 70**
- 71* Sweet Peas – three cut cultivars, seven spikes of each, one cultivar in each vase
- Queen Elizabeth Coronation Challenge Cup for best in Class 71**
- 72* Hanging basket (planted by entrant) - diameter up to 38cm/15in
- H M F Faure Challenge Cup for best in Class 72**
- 73* Cut Flowers - Three vases, one kind in each vase
- 74* Sweet Peas - Bowl of cut mixed colours, not more than 24 stems
- D Rossiter Cup for best in Class 74**
- 75 Dahlias - Two vases, three cut blooms in each
- 76 Fuchsias – in two pots each of which not to exceed 19cm/7.5in at the top
- Richard Daykin Memorial Cup for best in Class 76**
- 77 Dahlias - Vase of cut Pompom, five blooms
- 78 Carnations - Vase of cut Border, five stems
- 79 Roses - Vase of cut Rambler or Climber, three sprays
- 80 Flowering Shrubs – cut, in a vase
- 81 African Violets (Saintpaulia) – in two pots
- 82 Begonias - grown from tubers, in two pots which do not exceed 19cm/7.5in at the top
- 83 Flowering Plants - two different species in pots, other than Class 81 and 82
- pots not to exceed 19cm/7.5in at the top
- 84 Best Bloom - cut Spike or Spray in garden, one stem only, shown in exhibitor's own vase
- Norman Rogers Challenge Cup for best in Class 84**
- 85 Soft Fruit - two kinds, one dish of each
- 86* Flowers and Vegetables - two kinds of cut Flowers in vases, one kind in each vase; plus two kinds of Vegetables in dishes, one kind in each dish. Numbers of each kind of Vegetable to be as stated in Classes 30-48
- 87 Tomatoes - dish of five, stalk cut above knuckle
- 88 Cucumbers - two
- 89 Strawberries - dish of 10 with stalks
- 90 Garlic - three, with tops cut to not more than 7.5cm/3in
- 91 Scented Roses in a vase, minimum three, one or more cultivars
- 92 Vase of mixed foliage, minimum three kinds
- 93 Fruiting Plant in a pot/container - pot not to exceed 38cm/15in at the top
- 94 'One Colour' - two or more varieties of cut flower in a vase
(of the same colour eg different shades of blue)
- 95 Annual flowers in a pot/container, grown from seed - pot not to exceed 38cm/15in at the top
- 96 Selection of dried flowers/seed heads in a vase
- 97 Plant grown from a cutting - pot not to exceed 38cm/15in at the top
- 98 Unusual variety of a vegetable (please label variety if possible)

- 99 Funniest shaped vegetable - one only (Novelty Class)
- 100 Turnips - three with tops cut to 7.5cm/3in
- 101 Courgettes - three, 10-20cm/4-8in excluding stalks
- 102 Herbs - collection of minimum five kinds
- 103 Onion - the heaviest (Novelty Class)
